The University of Ghana, Department of Anatomy, under my headship, has funded this publication as contribution to vivifying West African Journal of Anatomy (Waja). It is hoped that patrons of WAJA will give us feedback to help with improvements in future volumes. For now, though, the Editorial team appeals for submission of quality manuscripts to enable us keep the very high standard set by our very competent and professional publishers and avoid a break in the volumes or cause it to lag in time.
